Dizzy Phino Cate Caterpillar



1. Divide each of the modelling clays into 6 (1/6 per person).



3. Add white and **tiny** amounts of black clay and blend together to create light and dark green.



5. Gently press the eyes onto the face and add a smile using a tool.



7. Using a skewer, carefully push holes into each piece of clay. Ask an adult for help if you'd prefer.



9. Thread a 40cm length of cotton onto a key ring using a 'Cow Hitch'.



2. Divide each green piece (1/6) into 5 pieces of roughly equal size.



4. Slightly flatten your clay. Use some black and white to create eyes.



6. Use white and a **tiny** amount of red to make some pink cheeks.



8. Harden in the oven at 120°C for 20 mins. Do not exceed a hardening temperature of 130°C



10. Once cool, thread your Caterpillar onto the cotton and keep in place using a knot (or three).



Lucky Ladybird



1. Divide each of the modelling clays into 6 (1/6 per person).



3. Use white and a **tiny** amount of red to make a pink face. Add more red if necessary.



5. Gently place the 'legs' onto a red ball. Next, press the spots onto another red ball and roll into a sphere.



7. Harden in the oven at 120°C for 20 mins. Do not exceed a hardening temperature of 130°C





2. Divide each 1/6 as shown in the diagram above.



4. Using a small amount of black and white, form the eyes; and black for the legs and spots.



6. Using one of the skewers, carefully push some holes into the clay. Ask an adult for help if you'd prefer.



8. Thread a 40cm length of cotton onto a key ring using a 'Cow Hitch'

9. Once cool, thread your Ladybird onto the waxed cotton and keep in place using a knot (or three).
